F.No.1(1)PD/ICTE/2024-25/(IR)14044-R.—In pursuance of Section 230J of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 the International Center for Tax Excellence (ICTE) is hereby established and operationalized with the following institutional obejctoves, functions, goverance structure and institutional linkages:

A. Institutional Objectives:

The ICTE will be a resource center on matters of taxation. The center shall develop a knowledge ecosystem for the FBR whereby research, data analytics and tax analytics will be used as tools to provide an institutional mechanism, *inter alia* for the following:

- (a) Mobilize and efficiently manage technical resources to provide data analytics on the tax data and support effective tax administration;
- (b) Generate inputs into data led tax administration;
- (c) Experiment and test data-based innovations in tax administration systems toward seeking improved collections, higher taxpayer compliance, and cost efficiencies;
- (d) Provide thought leadership, identify current/ emerging issues, write position papers to enable discussion on emerging topics relevant to tax administration;
- (e) Conduct periodical local tax surveys to provide an authoritative overview of the tax system in place and identify areas for improvement; and
- (f) conduct international seminars, workshops and conferences on the current issues faced by tax authorities in the field of international taxation, and
- (g) capacity building of Inland Revenue Officers.

The ICTE will have an institutional linkage with PRAL and have access to tax data in accordance with law and approved data management protocol(s).

B. Types of analysis and research:

ICTE will carry out two types of work:

- (a) Regular and mandated analytics for tax administration, assigned by Chairman FBR; and

- (b) Commissioned research requested by FBR field units and other government agencies.
- (e) Protocols to publish results of the center’s research

C. Governance and administration:

ICTE will work under an interim Board of Directors to be nominated by Chairman FBR. The Center will develop analytics and research subjects related to taxation and carry out its work in the following manner:

- a) FBR and the Board of Directors will assign data analytic tasks to the center: some of the analytics will be regular and ongoing; others on a case-by-case basis;
- b) Executive Director/Project Director will prepare an annual research agenda and present it to the Board of Directors;
- c) Ministry of Finance, TPO and other government agencies may also request research on particular subjects from time to time;
- d) The approved agenda will be converted into research plans identifying technical resources;
- e) Executive Director/Project Director will present the center’s annual budget to the Board of Directors for approval;
- f) The Directors’ Committee will create research teams and for this will bring on board the necessary technical experts, associate FBR employees and assign budgets;
- g) Data analytics and research outputs will be peer reviewed; for this purpose, a technical peer review process will be established;
- h) Analytics and research outputs will be presented to FBR and other stakeholders
- i) High value outputs will be published.

D. Protocols to Acquire Requisite Expertise:

The Center shall carry out its functions under the following legal instruments:

- (a) Rules for data access and management of data sharing;
- (b) Rules to hire short term experts from the market;
- (c) Detailed protocols to engage international and national academics;
- (d) Protocols to establish linkages with centers with similar work globally; and

- (f) Budgetary process and reporting.

E. Functions of the Project Director

The Project Director is assigned the following tasks:

- (a) Organize the activities of the Center in accordance with the notified functions;
- (b) Prepare and present the research agenda for 2025 with timelines and resources requirements to the Chairman FBR for approval;
- (c) Commission research on the approved agenda;

- i). No mechanized/ fishing craft or licensee is allowed to capture requiem shark (**Carcharhinidae spp.**); hammerhead shark (**Sphyrnidae spp.**); thresher shark (Alopiidae spp.); mackerel sharks (**Lamnidae spp.**); whale shark (**Rhincodontidae spp.**) or take sharks as bycatch unless authorized in a mariner consistent with international law or in conformity with national legislation within areas of national jurisdiction.
- ii). No mechanized/ fishing craft or licensee is allowed to capture juveniles of sharks less than 40 cm lower jaw fork length in case of bramble shark (**Echinorhinidae spp.**); bullhead shark (**Heterodontidae spp.**); sand tiger shark (**Odontaspidae spp.**); crocodile shark (**Pseudocarchariidae spp.**); longtail carpet shark (Hemiscyllidae spp.); zebra shark (**Stegostomatidae spp.**) nurse shark (**Ginglymostomatidae spp.**); catshark (**Scyliorhinidae spp.**); houndshark (**Triakidae spp.**); and weasel shark (**Hemigaleidae spp.**) throughout the year. Notwithstanding, spawning sharks are completely prohibited throughout the year.
- iii). Fishing craft operating in zone under the provision of Rule 3 of the Exclusive Fishery Zone (Regulation of fishing) Rules 1990, shall, to the extent possible, promptly release unharmed and unwanted shark species specified at Para (I) and (ii) caught alive on board of vessels. Such catches shall be reported in the logbook: including the status on release (dead or alive and size frequencies)
- iv). Possession, acquisition, receipt, transport, offering for sale, selling, or purchasing any detached fin or tail of a shark or any product or derivative of any fin or tail of a shark, including any export or re-export, is prohibited throughout the year.
- v). The Licensing Authority should ensure that where excess fishing capacity for the capture of sharks exists in EEL, mechanisms should be established to reduce capacity to levels commensurate with the sustainable use of shark fishery resources.
- vi). Recreational and sport fishers shall release all sharks alive. Under no circumstances shall they retain them on board, transship, land, store, sell or offer them for sale.
- vii). Possession, acquisition, receipt, transport, offering for sale, selling, or purchasing sawfish (**Pristiidae spp.**) is completely prohibited throughout the year.
- viii). Wedgefishes (**Rhinidae spp.**) and Guitarfishes (**Rhinobatidae spp.**) are allowed to be captured by

- mechanized/ fishing craft or licensee unless the Licensing Authority authorized in a manner consistent with international law or in conformity with national legislation within areas of national jurisdiction.
- ix). Mobulid rays (***Mobulidae spp.***) and eagle rays (***Myliobatidae spp.***) are not allowed to be captured, retained on board, transshipped, landed and stored. Prohibition to gaff, lift by the gill slits/spiracles, punch holes through the bodies. Obligation to release alive, implementation of live release handling procedures of mobulid rays.
- x). Prohibition to retain on board, tranship, land, any striped marlin (***Kajikia audax***), black marlin (***Istiompax indica***), blue marlin (***Makaira nigricans***), indo-pacific sailfish (***Istiophorus platypterus***) smaller than 60 cm lower jaw fork length.
